York County January the 11th 1883. By the decisions of Christopher Curtis, William Heath, Ray W. Smith and Thomas J. Heron Commissioners appointed by a decree of the Court of York County bearing date on the 18th day of October 1882 to lay off and settle to Martha M. Kimball widow of Robert Puffon, dec'd, her share in the 3600 acres of land the property of the said Robert Puffon dec'd, and then to divide the balance between the Plaintiff and heirs of said Puffon; I made the annual survey of said tract and of land there to be 183 acres in the whole. They then directed me to lay off twenty four acres including all the buildings and improvements by a line 46 1/2 poles from the corner of said land called Craig's N 77 W 101 poles to Puffell land purchased from Smiths heirs 16 1/2 poles from the river and which is exhibited on the Map by brown staining. They then directed me to lay off 36 1/2 acres on the side next to Puffell's Craig tract as lot N° 1, which by ballot fell to John P. Smith and Elizabeth his wife, and is exhibited on the Map by green staining, then 36 1/2 acres adjoining N° 1 as lot N° 2, which by ballot fell to Rebecca Puffon, and which is exhibited on the Map by a yellow staining; then 42 1/2 acres adjoining N° 2 as lot 3, which by ballot fell to Robert Puffon and which is exhibited on the Map by a pink staining, and then 42 1/2 acres adjoining N° 3 as lot N° 4 and which by ballot fell to William Puffon, and which is exhibited on the Map by a blue staining. The widow is allowed the privilege of fire wood and timber off all the wood land, and the grass way out to stand as it is for the convenience of the lower. The above was done by our directions and we certify that it may be accepted by the Court as our report of the survey of the land.
